IN THE MATTER OF GRANTING THE CENTRAL PACIFIC RAILWAY CO.'S PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT SPUR TRACK ACROSS "H" STREET, IN THE CITY OF MODESTO, COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

A Resolution granting to the Central Pacific Railway Co., A Corporation, its successors and assigns, a permit to lay down, construct, maintain and operate a spur railroad track of standard gauge over and across "H" Street, located in the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, State of California, for the purpose of serving industrial property with a spur track,

the particular description of said spur track necessary for the purpose aforesaid being as follows:

Beginning for a description of a spur track at a point on the South East line of H Street, said point being 68.5 ft southwesterly from the intersection of the southeast line of H Street and the southwest line of 9th Street; thence across H Street 80 feet to the northwest line of H Street, said point being 68.5 feet southwesterly from the intersection of the northwest line of H Street and the southwest line of 9th Street.

WHEREAS, the Central Pacific Railway Co., a Corporation, did on the 12th day of July, 1927, present its Petition and Application to this Council wherein it prayed that permission be granted to it and to its successors and assigns, a permit to lay down, construct, maintain and operate a spur railroad track of standard gauge, over and across H Street, in the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, the center line and location of said spur track being particularly set forth in said petition and application, and hereinafter particularly described; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the satisfaction of the City Council that the said spur track as prayed for, is convenient in order that said Central Pacific Railway Co. may properly conduct and carry on its business in said City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that there be and there hereby is, granted to the Central Pacific Ry. Co., a corporation, its successors, and assigns, a permit and the right privilege and permission to lay down, construct, maintain and operate a spur track of standard gauge over and across H Street in the said City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, for the purpose of serving industries and the center line of which said spur track is particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning for a description of a spur track at a point on the southeast line of H Street, said point being 68.5 feet southwesterly from the intersection of the southeast line of H Street and the southwest line of 9th Street, thence across H Street 80 feet to the northwest line of H Street, said point being 68.5 feet southwesterly from the intersection of the northwest line of H Street and the southwest line of 9th Street.

That this permit to lay down, construct, maintain and operate said railroad spur track is granted subject:

1. To such regulations and conditions as may be prescribed from time to time by the City Council of the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus.
2. To the use of said spur track for the transportation of freight only.
3. That said spur track must be laid level with the Street over and across which it passes and conforming with the City grades.
4. That it must be operated under such restrictions as not to interfere with the use of such streets by the public, and
5. That this permit shall be revocable at the pleasure of the City Council of the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus.
