WHEREAS, application had heretofore been made to the Council of the City of Modesto for a permit to lay down a spur or side track, together with the privilege of maintaining the same and running cars thereover crossing 8th Street between Jefferson and Washington Streets, and running thence down Washington Street to the alley running through Block 38, crossing "N" Street to said alley, and thence crossing "M" Street and running through the alley in Block 39, and thence crossing "L" Street and running through the alley in Block 40, with the privilege of additional spurs therefrom to various structures and warehouses erected or to be erected along said line, and also for the privilege of construct- from the alley in Block 38 two branching or lateral spurs in addition to the main spur crossing "M" Street with two spurs in the alley in Block 39, all as is more clearly delineated upon the map or blue print filed with the petition therefor, and now on file with the Clerk of this Board,

It is further ordered that said tracks must conform to the grade of the street and must be so operated as not to interfere with the use of the street by the public, and that proper crossings shall be maintained by the permittee, or its assigns, wherever said spur track crosses any of the streets or highways of the City of Modesto.

It is further ordered that such tracks shall be so constructed as not to interfere with full access to the sewers and water mains in said alleys and in such a way as to cause no injury thereto.

It is made a part of this permission that it shall be the duty of said permit- tee or its assigns to maintain its track during the work of repairing or constructing sewer or water mains by said city and that the City of Modesto shall not be responsible to said permittee by reason of said sewer or water mains.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 45.

Resolution of intention to extend and open Semple Street from its present southerly termination to Annie Street.

WHEREAS, the public interest and convenience requires that the improvement hereinafter described should be done, and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of this City Council, said contemplated improvement is, and is hereby declared to be, of more than local or ordinary public benefit, now

THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Modesto does hereby resolve and declare that it is the intention of said Council to order the following improvement to be made, to-wit:

That Semple Street in said city be extended and opened from its present southern termination as shown upon that certain map entitled Johnson and Jones Addition to the town of Modesto, Cal. filed in the office of the County Recorder of Stanislaus County, State of California, in book of maps 1, page 13, southerly to the northerly line of Annie Street.

The lands necessary and convenient to be taken for said purpose are described as follows, to-wit:

Bounded on the North by the Southerly Line of Jones Street, on the West by the Westerly Line of Semple Street produced and extended Southerly, on the South by the Northerly line of Annie Street, and on the East by the Easterly Line, produced Southerly, of the aforesaid Semple Street.

And said Council does hereby determine and declare that said proposed work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and will affect and benefit the lands and district hereinafter described, and which said district is hereby declared to be the district affected and benefited by said work and improvement, and that therefore the entire damages, costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be and are hereby made chargeable against and shall be assessed upon said lands and district, which district is within the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, State of California; and the exterior boundaries of the lands affected and benefited by said work and improvement are particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the South Line of Morris Avenue, distant (measured at right angles) one hundred fifty feet (150) from the East Line of Lot numbered nineteen (19) Perley and Ross Tract, filed in the office of County Recorder of Stanislaus County, California. Thence Westerly along the Southerly Line of Morris Avenue three hundred twenty (320) feet to the Easterly Line of alley through Lot numbered sixteen (16) Perley and Ross Tract, Thence Southerly along the Easterly Line of alley through Lot sixteen (16) Perley and Ross Tract, Blocks "B" and "D", Johnson and Jones Addition to Modesto, extended and produced and paralleled thereto, distant (measured at right angles) nineteen hundred twenty (1920) feet to the Northerly Line of Annie Street,
